SESSION DESCRIPTIONS:

Eureka: Planning and Sustaining a Eureka Math Implementation (K-12)	This session (appropriate for teachers and administrators) will describe tools and resources to support implementation of Eureka Math, including new resources for 2016-2017.
Guidebook 2.0 (Overview & How Do the Units Work?)	This session is suited for teachers, coaches, and supervisors who are new to the ELA Guidebook 2.0 units. The presenters will provide an overview of the background, features, and organization of the units and will demonstrate how to use the lesson player. Participants will leave this session with clear first steps for implementing Guidebook 2.0.
Navigating the Library of Congress-Primary Sources for Your Classroom (K-12)	The Library of Congress has an incredible collection of digitized resources and collections, including numerous primary sources, that can be used by educators to increase the rigor and relevance of their instruction. This session provides K–12 educators of all content areas with an introduction and demonstration about how to use and navigate the Library of Congress's website, resources, and collections.
Text Dependent Questioning	Simply putting harder texts in kids' hands will not accelerate reading achievement. In this session, teachers will learn expert techniques for unlocking difficult text in order to provide all students access. This session examines best practices for scaffolding these complex texts by designing and facilitating text-dependent questions. Participants will explore the process of breaking thinking into four cognitive pathways in order to organize students' journeys through a text and build an extended discussion around it.
Kagan Strategies	In this session, participants will learn instructional strategies designed to promote cooperation and communication in the classroom, boost students' confidence and retain their interest in classroom interaction.
